### Fort Rouge Curling Club

#### **Rules Reminder:**

- The 4 rock free guard zone rule is in effect.
- Game results must be recorded immediately following each game.
- The curling draw is posted on the bulletin board, the chalk board, and the website.
- Practice before games is being limited to 4 rocks thrown (2 there and 2 back). No limit on practise slides (without a rock).
- Play begins at 5 pm and ends promptly at 7 pm. The starting bell will ring 5 minutes before the start of play. The ending bell will ring at 95 minutes of play after which teams will complete the current end and play on more end.
- Teams that are not ready with at least three members on the ice to play by 10 minutes after the start of play (15 minutes after the starting bell) will forfeit the game.
- The league is a mixed league which must have one member of the opposite sex on the ice. Teams automatically lose the game if their one member of the opposite sex is not on the ice. Each team will be allowed one game where they will not automatically lose if their lone member of the opposite sex is not on the ice.
- Existing Rules for Spares:
  - Spares of any sex can be used at any time. A maximum of 3 spares in a single game can be used once. You can not use 3 spares in any other game. Teams will automatically incure a lose if they use 3 spares in one game a second time. The Vice-President/Draw Master will be monitoring this.
  - It will be the responsibility of all League members to arrange for their own Spares if they are unable to attend a game. Spares must play Lead, except where a team is using more than one, in which case Spares must play Lead and Second. Each team must have at least one registered team member for each game.
  - For playoff games, only one Spare is allowed per team.
  - Spares will not be charged a fee to play

#### **Curling Etitiqute:**

- Avoid kneeling on the ice or melting the ice with your hands.
- Use clean shoes for curling, not shoes you wear outside. They will bring grit and debris onto the ice.
- Old grippers leave smudges on the ice.
   Once your gripper becomes flat, replace it.
- Old brushes leave debris on the ice.
   Replace your brush every few years.
- Avoid wearing fleece (and other materials that shed) jackets and pants that shed fabric onto the ice.
- Be ready to start your game when the bell rings.
- As soon as your opponent delivers their rock, clean your rock and be ready to deliver it.
- "Team Decision Making" slows the game down, annoying curlers, and reduces your playing time.
- Do not play slow when your team is winning. It is not sportsmanlike.
- Your play must not interfere with the next league starting on time. With properly prepared ice. Ice is rented for a 2 hour period and does not guarantee a specific number of ends nor does it allow time for extra ends.

#### **Club News**

Fort Rouge is please to welcome back their experienced ice team, including Head Ice Technician Craig White. They shave our ice twice as much as the average club. The ice crew and improvements will ensure that we continue to be viewed as the club with the best ice in the city. Once again, they have enlisted world class Ice Technician Greg Ewasko to assist with ice installation this season.

The Club has been busy over the summer with a few projects: code replacement of backflow preventer in plant room (\$1700); new Wall of Fame shelving in Lounge (\$350); and Kitchen renovation including code upgrades such as a balanced fresh air intake system, new energy efficient appliances such as a double decker pizza oven, gas range, refrigerator, stand up freezer and new prep table (\$150,000 (estimate).

The club aggressively pursue government grants for our major renovation projects. By doing so, they have been able to lessen the burden on our curlers to modest fee increases. They have been fortunate to secure \$71,000 in grants from the Federal and Municipal governments to lessen our project cost burden. They also are lucky to have the "sweat equity" free of charge, from some volunteer Board members who offered their time doing demolition work to lessen our cost burden. Fort Rouge continues to strive to be the most pleasant, comfortable and fun place to curl in Winnipeg.

Fort Rouge CC continues to employ a fee policy whereby their fees for comparable time slots are neither the highest nor the lowest in the city. They have used information collected from surveys conducted by the Association of Winnipeg Curling Clubs and information on club websites as a guide to setting their fees. Unfortunately, small business operations like FRCC have been hit hard by numerous cost increases such as a decade of minimum wage increases, numerous alcohol price increases ( which we have subsidized over the last few years ), utilities cost increases, distribution cost increases due to the slumping Canadian dollar and as you will see from your own grocery bills, a significant price increase in food products, especially meat. They continue to strive to give you a great curling experience at a great value.

Fort Rouge is known throughout the city as being a club that values practice. This is not the norm at all clubs. They offer a variety of times for drop in practice midweek and ice that can be booked by members free of charge on the weekend. You can also rent a time slot to guarantee a particular time. Please see the Ice Book for details ( located on the shelf by the guest phone on the main floor).

The Club continues to develop their website. They uploaded a sleek new look with greater functionality 2 summers ago and are currently in the development stages of producing a brand new website with even more user friendly features. They hope to unveil this to our members by the end of this curling season.
